A MESSAGE FROM THE FINANCE COMMITTEE

The Finance Committee held its annual end-of-year meeting on December 30 to review our financial condition, and to decide whether we would be able to meet the goal of paying 10% of certain types of our applicable revenues as our “Apportionment” to the Conference. With some exceptions, all member churches of the United Methodist Church are asked to tithe 10% each year. Each year, the Finance Committee sets aside certain income for Apportionments, including the special offerings that are made for Easter, Thanksgiving and Christmas, earnings from the scrip program, and the net proceeds of the Fall Festival.

Normally, the income from these special offerings and fundraisers falls short of our 10% apportionment obligation, and we have had to add some money from our General Fund. Sometimes this has created cash flow problems for the church, and some years in the past, we have not been able to make up the shortfall, and have not met our obligation.

We are pleased to report that our 2024 income from the special sources listed above actually exceeded the total needed to meet our 10% obligation, and in fact for the first time ever, we were actually able to transfer \$3,000 into the General Fund on December 31 to give us a bit of a cushion heading into the new year.

Thank you to all for your financial support, and we are looking forward to an even better 2025!

Administrative Council Highlights – December 3, 2024

The Ad Council met by Zoom conference on Tuesday, December 3, 2024 with nine people present. The following items were discussed:

- **Nurture, Outreach and Witness (NOW).** Bud stated that the NOW Committee met on November 18. The women would meet on December 12 at the Four Seasons for their Christmas Party. All women are invited. VBS dates will be June 23 through June 27. We plan to decorate the sanctuary after church and lunch on December 1.
- **Trustees.** Lori is making a list of the users of our church facilities, how often and when they use our buildings, and how much they pay. The Rainbow Room faucet is broken and the thermostat in the Fireside Room is not working. The Relay for Life organization has asked to use the Fellowship Hall and kitchen for an annual breakfast for Cancer Survivors. After some discussion, it was agreed to allow the use for a \$50.00 fee. Russ is still working on the sprinkler repairs. Jim Jones has proposed replacing the dumpster with two garbage cans, which would save the church money. Where the cans will be stored is to be determined. The dishwasher needs repairs; its valve had to be shut off after each use during the Fall Festival dinner. The new ice maker is working great.
- **United Women in Faith.** Laura Scott reported that the women are helping a family in need. The women will gather on December 12 at the Four Seasons for their Christmas Party. All women are invited. On January 11, 2025, the women will meet for lunch at Espana's.
- **Staff-Parish Relations Committee.** We have been approved for another \$5,000.00 grant to support the youth program.
- **Financial Report.** There was no current report of the church's finances, but preliminary total proceeds for the 2024 Fall Festival were over \$10,000. The Finance Committee will meet late in December to decide how much our church can safely pay toward 2024 apportionments; it was likely that we would again meet our 100% goal.
- **Recap of the Fall Festival.** Pending any expenses that need to be reimbursed, the gross income for the Spaghetti Dinner was \$1,503. We made \$250 from craft booth rentals, \$3,500 from the Disney Raffle, \$1,117 from the general raffle, and \$4,000 from the Tongan online raffle handled by Foa and Ivoni, for an overall total of \$10,370. It was agreed that the entire event was very successful, and repeated in 2025. It was suggested that we advertise on the town marquee next year, which would cost approximately \$100.00 for a month. We will also look into setting up a Venmo or Zelle account for the church.
- **Upcoming Events.** Brief mention was made of the following upcoming events:
 - a. 2025 all-church planning meeting – Sunday, January 19 after church
 - b. VBS – June 23-27, 2025
 - c. Fireworks booth at Target parking lot – June 28 - July 4, 2025
 - d. Date TBD - Susan and Hans Younce have proposed a drive-through BBQ Chicken Dinner
 - e. Date TBD – rummage sale
- **Parish Care.** Prayers were requested for Rhonda's father, Dan Wilson.
- **Pastor's Report.** Ivoni has been in contact with and/or visited a number of our church family members, and has performed several services for non-member families at the San Joaquin Valley National Cemetery. She has submitted a grant request for \$20,000 to help pay for her full-time salary in 2025. She will be on vacation December 10 to 13, 2024, and December 26, 2024 to January 3, 2025. She has asked Jason to preach for her on Sunday, December 29.

Easy week night dinner

Lemon Herb Grilled Chicken

This Lemon Herb Grilled Chicken is easily made with just a few simple ingredients for a delicious, healthy meal! Packed with so much flavor thanks to tangy lemon juice, tons of garlic, and fresh thyme!

Prep Time 10 minutes mins

Cook Time 15 minutes mins

Total Time 25 minutes mins

Course: dinner, Main Course

Ingredients

- 2 lbs. boneless, skinless chicken thighs
- 2 Tbsp olive oil
- Juice of 2 lemons
- 2 tsp lemon zest
- 4 cloves garlic minced
- 2 Tbsp fresh thyme and fresh rosemary
- Salt and black pepper to taste

Instructions

To Make the Marinade:

1. In a small bowl or jar, whisk together the olive oil, lemon juice, garlic, fresh herbs, salt and pepper until all combined.

Prepare the Chicken:

1. Place chicken in a shallow dish or a 1-gallon sealable plastic bag and pour most of the lemon herb sauce over the chicken (I always suggest reserving a little bit of the sauce to brush on the chicken later while grilling!)
2. Place chicken in the fridge and let it marinate for at least 30 minutes, but no longer than 2 hours (lemon is very acidic and will start to break down the chicken's texture so you don't want to marinate this too long). When ready to grill, remove chicken from the dish or bag, shake off any excess and discard leftover marinade.
3. Heat a grill or grill pan on medium heat and brush grill with oil to prevent the chicken from sticking. Grill the chicken for 5 to 6 minutes on each side or until cooked through and no longer pink (cooked chicken should have an internal temp of 165 degrees). Remove chicken from grill and let it rest for 5 minutes before serving.
